## Hearing on: HB2278 — Removing reference to the association of official analytical chemists in agricultural liming materials provisions.

Natalie Scott, Revisor, provided an overview of the bill, explaining that the bill amend current law by striking the language referencing the association of official analytical chemists and simply provide that the methods used will be prescribed in rules and regulations by the secretary of agriculture (Attachment 1).

Greg Foley, Division of Conservation, Department of Agriculture, appeared before the Committee in support of <a href="HB2278">HB2278</a> (Attachment 2). Mr. Foley explained that the Department is in the process of updating the regulations governing agricultural lime testing protocol to match that of Kansas State University Soils Testing Laboratory, indicating that the testing laboratory calculation is a more accurate method than the current State of Kansas' written regulation.

Responding to questions from the Committee, Mr. Foley indicated that rules and regulations will be written by the agency if the legislation is enacted by the Legislature.

There were no other conferees to appear before the Committee.

The hearing on **HB2278** was closed.

wells for personal use for the purpose of heating a residential dwelling or any other structure located on the premises.
