Hearing on: SB46 — Identification of domesticated deer.

Chair Schwartz opened the hearing on <u>SB46</u>. Natalie Scott, Revisor, provided a brief description of the bill, explaining that <u>SB46</u> is identical to <u>HB2029</u> which had a hearing in the Committee on January 27, 2015; passed out of the Committee on February 10, 2015; passed out of the House; however, is not anticipated to have any action in the Senate this session (<u>Attachment 1</u>).

Travis Lowe, Kansas Cervid Breeders Association, appeared before the Committee in support of <u>SB46</u> (<u>Attachment 2</u>). Mr. Lowe explained that <u>SB46</u> clarifies tagging requirements for domestic elk and deer. Mr. Lowe noted that <u>HB2029</u> passed on the House floor 114-0 and <u>SB46</u> passed on the Senate floor 40-0.

There were no other conferees, either proponent, neutral or opponents, to come before the Committee.

The hearing on **SB46** was closed.

Presentation on Kansas Corn Commission

Kent Moore, Chairman, Kansas Corn Commission, presented the annual legislative report on the Kansas Corn Commission (Attachment 3). Mr. Moore noted that the goal of the Kansas Corn Commission is to enhance the profitability of corn for Kansas farmers. The Commission's work on market development is focused on livestock and ethanol industries as well as building export markets for corn and products including corn-fed beef and pork.

Presentation on Kansas Grain Sorghum Commission

Clayton Short, Fifth District Commissioner, Kansas Grain Sorghum Commission, appeared before the Committee to present the annual report for the Kansas Grain Sorghum Commission (Attachment 4) (Attachment 5) (Attachment 6). Mr. Short explained that funds received through the Sorghum Checkoff Program have benefited Kansas sorghum producers by facilitating a focused industry including; a unified voice in sorghum promotion and market development, elimination of duplicate state research and greater resources for higher investment research initiatives.

Mr. Short responded to questions from the Committee.

Presentation on Kansas Soybean Commission

Jerry Jeschke, Kansas Soybean Commission, appeared before the Committee and presented the annual report for the Kansas Soybean Commission (Attachment 7).

Mr. Jeschke reported:

- There are 3 Kansas members on the national board.
- 2014 average yield of 37 bushel per acre.
- 1/2 of exported soybeans are shipped to China

Mr. Jeschke responded to questions from the Committee.

Presentation on Kansas Sunflower Commission

The written annual report from the Kansas Sunflower Commission was distributed to the Committee, including information on the check-off program, audit report and financial statements. No one was present to appear before the Committee to address the report (Attachment 8).
