<u>Discussion & action on: SB52 — Authorizing chief engineer to allow augmentation to secure</u> water.

Chair Schwartz opened the discussion on **SB52**; a bill that had a hearing in this Committee on March 12, 2015.

Natalie Scott, Revisor, explained that <u>SB52</u> amends current law with regard to the options available when the chief engineer makes a determination of an unlawful diversion of water. Ms. Scott notes that senate amendments limit the use of augmentation to the Rattlesnake Creek sub-basin and provide that augmentation may only be used when the replacement of water is offered voluntarily.

Representative Francis moved to recommend **SB52** favorable for passage. Motion seconded by Representative Ewy.

Representative Francis made a substitute motion to amend SB52 by moving the contents of SB36 into SB52. Motion seconded by Representative Concannon. Motion carried on a voice vote.

Natalie Scott, Revisor, explained <u>SB36</u> amends the provisions relating to term permits to appropriate water and multiyear flex accounts. SB36 would allow users to carry-forward water appropriations.

Discussion followed.

Representative Sloan moved to amend SB52 by moving the contents of SB227 into SB52. Motion seconded by Representative Dierks. Motion carried on a voice vote.

Natalie Scott, Revisor, explained **SB227** amends the provisions relating to local enhanced management areas.

Discussion followed.

<u>Representative Sloan offered an amendment to SB52 (Attachment 1). The motion was seconded by Representative Wilson. Motion carried on a voice vote.</u>

During discussion, the Committee expressed some reluctance to adopting the amendment, mainly, because the amendment removes the restriction of the affected area to Rattlesnake Creek sub-basin.

<u>Representative Sloan moved to recommend SB52 as amended favorable for passage and allow for technical corrections as needed. Motion seconded by Representative Wilson. Motion carried on a voice vote.</u>

<u>Discussion & action on: SB124 — Eliminating the sunset on landspreading of oil and gas drilling waste.</u>

Chair Schwartz opened the discussion on <u>SB124</u>. Natalie Scott, Revisor, explained that <u>SB124</u> would authorize the Secretary of Health and Environment to adopt rules and regulations on the land-spreading of solid waste generated by drilling oil and gas wells. Chair Schwartz informed the Committee of the intention to amend <u>SB124</u> by inserting language from <u>SB125</u> and <u>HB2303</u> into <u>SB124</u>.

<u>Representative Sloan moved to recommend SB124 favorable for passage. Motion seconded by Representative Thimesch.</u>

<u>Representative Carlin made a substitute motion to amend SB124 by moving the contents of SB125 into SB124. Motion seconded by Representative Dierks. Motion carried on a voice vote.</u>

Natalie Scott, Revisor, explained that <u>SB125</u> allows for the disposal of waste containing low concentration of naturally-occurring radioactive materials (NORM) and technologically-enhanced NORM (TENORM) by underground burial.

Representative Sloan moved to amend **SB124** by moving the contents of **HB2303** into **SB124**. Motion seconded by Representative Clark. Motion carried on a voice vote.

Natalie Scott, Revisor, explained that **HB2303** amends current law relating to water and soil pollution.

As requested by the Division of Environment, Department of Health and Environment during their testimony at the hearing on **HB2303**, the following amendment was offered.

Representative Boldra moved to amend SB124 by including an amendment as requested by the

<u>Representative Sloan moved to amend the original SB124 by inserting language on page 4 as per the attachment (Attachment 2). The motion was seconded by Representative Lusker. Motion carried on a voice vote.</u>

<u>Representative Sloan moved to amend the original version of SB124 by inserting language on page 3</u> as per the attachment (Attachment 2). Motion was seconded by Representative Carlin. Motion carried on a voice vote.

<u>Representative Sloan moved to amend the original SB124 by striking the sunset date on page 4, line 16</u>
(Attachment 2). Motion was seconded by Representative Schroader. Motion carried on a voice vote.

<u>Representative Dierks moved to approve a technical amendment to correct the numbering in the</u> <u>amended version of **SB124** as needed. Motion seconded by Representative Lusker. Motion carried on a voice vote.</u>

<u>Representative Sloan moved to recommend SB124 as amended favorable for passage and allow for technical corrections as needed. Motion was seconded by Representative Carlin. Motion carried on a voice vote.</u>
