## Dear Chairman Ryckman:

Below please find the explanation of "Delete \$4.6 million, all from the State General Fund, for less budgeted disaster relief expenditures as per the agency's current disaster relief payout schedule in FY 2015."

It is difficult to predict the total amount of disaster funds to be distributed to eligible applicants because of several factors:

- 1. The first estimate and allocation is based off the initial damage assessment taken within the first 30-60 days following the disaster event. Detailed estimates are difficult at times to obtain due to the disaster itself. For example, many times projects are covered with debris at the time of the assessment; roads may be underwater; an inspection from a licensed engineer or architect may be needed. Sometimes the applicant is not sure what is covered by insurance.
- 2. Many large projects, those over \$121,600 may take four to five years to complete and there are many submittals of actual invoices. These projects are typically facilities such as schools, city/owned buildings, water treatment facilities, etc. Projects spanning over this many years can see an increase/decrease in the cost of materials, increase/decrease in labor costs as well as weather conditions that delay construction or provide the availability of contractors. The applicant may also have to comply with building code standards that were not known at the time of the initial estimate.

3. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) may determine that a project or certain item on the project does not qualify. Therefore, the project may not occur or the applicant might appeal FEMA's decision, which may take several years to resolve.

The ending balance of \$2.6M will be used to finance any adjustments to current open disasters and future disasters, which can occur at any time. Currently there are five federal disasters open in Kansas.

With the threat of ice storms yet this winter, and tornado and flood season fast approaching, the remaining balance of the disaster funds can be used to pay any state associated-costs necessary to take immediate protective measures. Examples include: National Guard State Active Duty, deployment of pumps; procurement of drinking or potable water; deployment of generators; emergency debris removal; and other life-saving expenses necessary to protect people, property and environment.

The cost of a disaster belongs to the state. Receiving a major federal declaration is not a guarantee. The magnitude and severity of the disaster, the impacts to the state and a threshold of more than \$4 million must be met before there is any federal cost-share reimbursement.

State disaster funds are only available when the Kansas legislature is in session and appropriates these funds or by a special meeting of the State Financial Council. If there are not sufficient disaster funds, then we lose our ability to take emergency actions or lessen/eliminate the impacts of the disaster.

We respectfully ask that you leave the remaining balance in place for future disasters.
