In 2012, the Legislature enacted Governor Brownback's proposal for an innovative plan to enhance career technical education in Kansas and to better prepare high school students for college and careers.

Senate Bill 155 provides free college tuition for high school students in postsecondary technical education courses and incentives to school districts for students earning industry-recognized credentials in high demand occupations (visit **kansasregents.org** and click on "Excel in CTE Initiative (SB155)" under "Workforce Development" for a complete list of qualifying credentials).
