## Hearing on: HB2395 — State building projects; negotiating committees; alternative procurement.

Chairperson Hutton opened the hearing on this bill. Chuck Reimer, Revisor of Statutes, gave an overview.

Jarrod Mann, American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC) provided proponent testimony (Attachment 1). He explained the bill increases the threshold at which a negotiating committee must be convened in procuring professional design services. He added the current threshold has been in place for almost a decade and no longer is reflective of today's economy. ACEC agrees with this section of the bill

The second change provides for amendments to the requirements for advertising of projects and public hearings, and ACEC is neutral.

There were no questions.

Elaine Frisby, Kansas Board of Regents, testified (Attachment 2) as a proponent of the bill explaining the bill will save the Board of Regents time and money associated with advertising and the waiting period for a hearing.

Mike Gibson, AGC, provided verbal comments (no testimony submitted) in opposition to the bill. He noted he agrees with the threshold increase, but opposes deleting the public hearing.
