Hearing on: HB2357 — Department of labor; employment security; disqualification for benefits, administrative review, personnel carrying out act, filing of wage reports.

Chairperson Hutton opened the hearing on the bill. Chuck Reimer explained the bill.

Justin McFarland, Department of Labor, was the only person testifying. He furnished testimony (Attachment 1) as a proponent and explained this bill addresses a few issues within the Kansas Employment Security law:

- --It ensures individuals do not fore go reasonable employment opportunities while receiving unemployment benefits.
- --It closes a loophole that disqualifies individuals who begin substitute teaching while receive unemployment benefits.
- --It clarifies the process to appeal a decision of the Kansas employment security board of review.
- --It removes unconstitutional language that unduly restricts KDOL employees' abilities to participate in political activities.
- --It requires all employers to file quarterly wage reports electronically.

The fiscal note indicates unemployed insurance benefit payments would increase by \$543,834 in both FY 2016 and FY2017. However, the Department of Labor estimates that the Employment Security Trust Fund can absorb the additional UI benefits without adjusting the current unemployment tax rates.
