Beau Bragg used his experience in playing golf to point out that a repeated lack of success is made worthwhile when success is finally achieved. Students cannot make a successful shot without first having the opportunity to make the shot.

Jennifer Hofferber expressed the importance of hiring and retaining good paraprofessionals for the classroom, especially in special education classes where the students benefit from consistent, long-term relationships with the staff.

Shannon Ralph spoke to the importance of developing critical thinking skills.

Dennis Munk emphasized the need to provide opportunities for students to apply what they are learning.

Jamie McDaniel spoke of the need for teachers to establish an emotionally safe environment supported by instruction in character development to provide a climate where learning can take place.

Lisa Holt expressed her belief that there is fairly good support for younger autistic students and also voiced her concern about the lack of opportunity for older autistic students to enter the work force.

Abby Hedrick shared her personal experience of beginning to work with the Common Core mathematics standards.

Kimberly Nelson spoke to the need to focus on the child when making decisions about education.

The Chairmen opened the meeting for questions from committee members. In response to a question from Senator Hensley, Mr. Dennis acknowledged it is unusual to have two instructors from the same school district on the same Teacher of the Year Team.

Senate members were excused to the Senate floor at 2:24 p.m.

House members continue asking questions. Shannon Ralph expressed the team's desire to be available to answer questions from committee members as the session progresses.

The meeting adjourned at 2:36 p.m.
