Possible bill introductions

The Chairman asked for bill introductions.

Representative Boldra offered a bill for introduction that would establish a second school district lottery game, clarifying that the bill introduced at a previous meeting was specific to lower grade levels and her bill encompassed all grade levels. The bill was accepted without objection.

<u>Discussion & possible action on: HB2457 — Amending the tax credit for low income students scholarship program act.</u>

The Chairman opened the meeting for discussion on **HB2457**.

Representative Kelley offered an amendment to <u>HB2457</u>. The Chairman asked Nick Myers to brief the committee on the bill and explain the amendment. Representative Kelley's amendment would change the percentage of federal poverty level used to determine qualification from 250% to 185%; it would allow for a 90% tax credit rather than a 100% tax credit; and it would insert new language in place of section (d). Discussion took place on the amendment. Richard Cram from the Department of Revenue offered information from the audience at the request of the Chairman in response to questions from committee members. (Attachment 1)

<u>Representative Kelley moved approval of her amendment; Representative Rhoades seconded the motion. The motion passed.</u>

Discussion returned to the bill.
