Chairman Highland opened the meeting and noted the need to approve minutes for January 19, 21, 25 and 26. <u>Representative Bradford moved and Representative Boldra seconded the minutes for those dates be approved. The motion passed.</u>

Vice-Chairman Lunn opened the hearing on <u>HB2532</u> and asked Tamera Lawrence to provide an overview of the bill.

Chairman Highland spoke as a proponent of <u>HB2532</u>, commenting that the bill simply includes financial literacy as part of the Rose Capacities. The Chairman answered questions from the committee. (Attachment 3)

Mark Desetti gave support for <u>HB2532</u>, emphasizing it allows local control in determining how to provide the instruction. (Attachment 4)

Tallman spoke in favor of <u>HB2532</u>, agreeing with the intention of the bill and commenting that members of his organization have adopted a statement in favor of each district developing a policy for meeting financial literacy goals. (Attachment 5)

Walt Chappell gave support for <u>HB2532</u> and encouraged the committee to consider amending the bill to establish financial literacy as a requirement for high school graduation.
