# Hearing and possible action on: SB388 — Requiring the state board of regents to adopt a policy on awarding credit hours based on CLEP test results.

Chairman Highland opened the hearing on **SB388** and asked Tamera Lawrence to give an overview of the bill. (Attachment 1)

Blake Flanders spoke in favor of <u>SB388</u>, commenting that the provisions of the bill could encourage adults to return to postsecondary education and also allow for easier transfer of CLEP credits within the postsecondary system.
