Procedure for Calling and Holding a Bond Election

Board must adopt a resolution stating the purpose and the estimated amount for which bonds are to be issued.

Elections must be held in accordance with provisions of the General Bond law.

Notice of election must be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in the school district, with the first publication to be not less than 21 days prior to the election. (KSA 10-120)

The notice must state:

- Name of district
- Date of bond election
- Amount of bonds to be issued
- 4. Proposition to be voted upon
- 5. Hours of opening and closing the polls
- Voting place or places and the territory each voting place is to serve
- Any other information specifically required by law (KSA 25-2018(f))

Election

The county election officer, who is the county clerk in most districts but the election commissioner in others, is in charge of the election.

All qualified electors of the district are entitled to vote.

The vote must be by official ballot.

A majority vote of those electors voting determines the results of the election.

Mail Ballot Election

KSA 25-432—An election shall not be held under the act unless:

- Conducted on a date, mutually agreed upon by the governing body of the political or taxing subdivision and the county election officer, not later than 120 days following the date the request is submitted by the political or taxing subdivision.
- 2. The Secretary of State approves a written plan for conduct of the election, which shall include a written timetable for the conduct of the election, submitted by the county election officer.
- 3. The election is nonpartisan.
- 4. The election is a question submitted election at which all of the qualified electors of one or any of the following subdivisions of government are the only electors eligible to vote—school districts and community college districts.

Extraordinary Declining Enrollment

KSA 75-2321 – If enrollment in a district has declined during the preceding three school years at a rate of at least 5% per year or by at least 50 pupils per year, whichever is greater, the board of education shall not authorize the issuance of any bonds for the construction of a new building without having first advised and consulted with the Joint Committee on State Building Construction. If the joint committee recommends against the issuance of any bonds and if the district proceeds to issue bonds, the district shall not be entitled to state aid for such bonds.

Registration and Selling of Bonds

The board of education shall publish a notice of the sale one time in a newspaper having general circulation in the county where the bonds are issued and in the Kansas Register. Such notices shall be published not less than six days nor more than 30 days before the sale and shall contain the following information.

The dates on which interest on the bonds shall become due and payable.

The assessed valuation of the municipality.

Terms and Denominations of Municipal Bonds

Municipal bonds shall be issued to mature in not more than 30 installments. The last installment shall mature not more than 32 years after the date of issuance. Such bonds shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed the maximum rate of interest prescribed by KSA 10-1009, payable at such times fixed by the municipality issuing the bonds.

Rates of Interest

The maximum stated rate of interest which may be fixed on fixed-rate bonds issued by municipality or taxing subdivision of the state of Kansas shall be determined on the day the bonds are sold and shall not exceed the daily yield for the ten-year treasury bonds published by The Bond Buyer, in New York, New York, on the Monday next preceding the day on which the bonds are sold, plus (1) three percent, if the interst on the bonds is excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes or (2) four percent, if the interest on the bonds is included in gross income for federal income tax purposes.

Bond Payments When Territory Transferred or District Disorganized

All territory within a school district on the date bonds of the district are issued remains liable for the payment of such bonds even though some of the territory subsequently is transferred or the district is disorganized.

Bond Elections—Frequency Limitation

No school district can call or hold more than one special bond election at a time other than a general election or the election of board of education members within any one calendar year. In addition, no special bond election can be held within (60) days before or after a general election or election of members of the board of education of the district. However, districts are not prohibited from planning for or considering a bond election during the period between authorized bond elections, nor from giving notice or making other preparations for an election during such period.

These restrictions have no application to an election for authorization to levy a capital outlay tax.

1000 INSTRUCTION

Instruction includes the activities dealing directly with the interaction between teachers and students. Teaching may be provided for students in a school classroom, in another location such as a home or hospital, and in other learning situations such as those involving co-curricular activities. This includes expenditures formerly reported under 3400 Student Activities. Teaching may also be provided through some other approved medium such as two-way interactive video, television, radio, telephone, and correspondence. Included here are the activities of aides or classroom assistants of any type (clerks, graders, teaching machines, etc.) which assist in the instructional process.

Include only regular and part-time teachers, teacher aides or assistants, homebound teachers, hospital-based teachers, substitute teachers, and teachers on sabbatical leave. If proration of expenditures is not possible for department chairpersons who also teach, include department chairpersons who also teach in instruction. Full-time department chairperson's expenditures should be included only in 2490.

2000 SUPPORT SERVICES

Support services provide administrative, technical (such as guidance and health), and logistical support to facilitate and enhance instruction. These services exist to fulfill the objectives of instruction, community services and enterprise programs, rather than as entities within themselves. The subfunctions of this function include: Student Support Services, Instructional Staff Support Services, General Administration, School Administration, Operation and Maintenance of Plant Services, Student Transportation, Central Services, and Other Support.

3000 OPERATION OF NON-INSTRUCTIONAL SERVICES

Activities concerned with providing non-instructional services to students, staff, or the community. This would include such activities as food service operations, enterprise operations (such as LEA bookstores) and community services (such as recreation, public library, and historical museum).

4000 FACILITIES ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION

Activities concerned with acquiring land and buildings; remodeling buildings; constructing buildings and additions to buildings; initially installing or extending service systems and other built-in equipment; and improving sites.

5000 DEBT SERVICE

A number of outlays of governmental funds are not properly classified as expenditures, but still require budgetary or accounting control. These are classified under *Debt Service*. Activities related to servicing the long-term debt of the school district, including payments of both principal and interest. This function should be used to account for bond interest payments, retirement of bonded debt, capital lease payments and other long-term notes. Interest on short-term notes or loans is charged to function 2513.
