

I am a very concerned parent of two K-12 students. I am quite disappointed in the actions of those who are attempting to acquire personal information of students that is not needed, nor asked for parental permission for the information and/or its release. I am specifically referencing Rep. Boldra and a lobbyist and the introduction of the bill **HB 2099**.

I would like to encourage the Education Committee to oppose the bill, **HB 2099**, and to strengthen the data privacy law of last years **SB 367** at **K.S.A. 72-6215 - 72-6223**. I firmly believe that I, as a parent, should be able to opt in my children for any surveys and data collected, and to be shown copies of the data that is to be collected. No one outside of my children's schools needs to know personal information, let alone information that is not pertinent to their education.

There has been too much sampling of students information, and of their families, and students are unwittingly providing that information because they don't understand what the surveys are for. The Common Core curriculum gets too much information from students as well, and that too needs to be halted. I have hope that **HB 2292** will repeal Common Core for Kansas students.
