Consideration of: HB2258 — Amending the Kansas mortgage business act.

The Chair invited consideration of **HB2258**. *Representative Campbell made a motion to recommend the bill as favorable for passage. Seconded by Representative Frownfelter, the motion passed unanimously.*

Consideration of: HB2259 — Amending the county and municipal statement of indebtedness reporting deadlines.

The Chair invited consideration of **HB2259**. Chairman DeGraaf offered a balloon amendment and asked staff Matt Sterling to explain it. Mr. Sterling said that the amendment would require the State Treasurer to publish the county reports on its website ([Attachment 1](#)).

A motion was made by Chairman DeGraaf and seconded by Representative Frownfelter to accept the amendment. The motion passed unanimously.

*A motion was made by Representative Campbell, seconded by Representative Frownfelter, to recommend **HB2259** as amended as favorable for passage. The motion passed unanimously.*

Consideration of: HB2260 — Eliminating the one-sheet requirement for temporary notes for improvements.

The Chair invited consideration of **HB2260**. Responding to a question, Staff Eileen Ma explained that the changes on page one, lines 35-36, and page two, lines 10-19, were only to make the text more
