Hearing on: HB2149 — Relating to donor human breast milk.

Chairman Hawkins opened the hearing on **HB2149**. Norm Furse, staff revisor, gave a summary of the bill.

Chairman Hawkins opened the hearing to proponents.

Christine Pai is a neonatal nurse practitioner at St Luke's Hospital. She testified in support of the bill which would allow medical care facilities, including hospitals, to be reimbursed for providing medically prescribed donor human milk to critically ill infants who are under three months of age and receiving treatment in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) of a hospital. There is not a single, more cost effective, natural and simple intervention that can provide to babies that has such a powerful impact. She stood for questions from the committee. (Attachment 1)
