Hearing on: HCR5004 — Constitutional amendment revising article 3, relating to the judiciary; providing for direct partisan election of supreme court justices and court of appeals judges; abolishing the supreme court nominating commission.

Chairperson Barker announced that he was opening the hearings on both HCR5004 and HCR5004 and HCR5004 and HCR5004 and HCR5004 and HCR5005 is Clayton Barker on behalf of the Kansas Republican Party, and his testimony is written only (Attachment 1). Chairperson Barker recognized Gerald Green, President of the Kansas Bar Association, as an opponent to <u>HCR5004</u> and <u>HCR5005</u> (<u>Attachment 11</u>). Questions were addressed to Mr. Green by Representatives John Rubin, John Whitmer, and Mark Kahrs.
