Mr. Molina advised that he wants to withdraw the bill introduced in this Committee earlier this year relating to the Kansas General Corporation Code. Seeing no objection, Chairperson Barker withdrew that bill request.

<u>Hearing on: HCR5013 — Constitutional amendment revising article 3, relating to the judiciary; placing the court of appeals into the constitution; changing the membership of the supreme court nominating commission.</u>
