Bill introductions

Representative Hutton made a motion to introduce a bill concerning property tax exemptions for pipelines. Representative Hedke seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Representative Hutton made a motion to introduce a bill concerning future property being exempted from tax required to pay a 20 mil school levy. Vice Chair Suellentrop seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Representative Hutton made a motion to introduce a bill concerning insurance and parity between behavioral health and physical health coverage. Representative Corbet seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Representative Lunn made a motion to introduce a bill concerning property exempted from tax required to pay 20 mil school levy. Vice Chair Suellentrop seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Representative Lunn made a motion to introduce a bill concerning property exempted from tax required to pay 5 mil for school levy. Vice Chair Suellentrop seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Representative Hineman made a motion to introduce a bill concerning appeals of property valuations for property tax, and restricting appeals to one time period prior to setting of local school and government budgets. Representative Wolfe Moore seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Representative Hineman made a motion to introduce a bill concerning the adjustment of statewide mill levy for schools from 20 mils to 30 mils. Representative Bridges seconded the motion. Motion passed.
