RE: HB 2306

Opposition of McLane Company, Inc.'s Kansas Employees to HB 2306

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

I am James Rankin and I represent McLane Company, Inc. Attached to this testimony is an economic impact statement demonstrating my client's corporate presence in Kansas. While McLane Company is not a Kansas based business, my client clearly participates in a most positive fashion in helping support jobs and growth in the Kansas economy. Distribution of alcoholic beverages and tobacco products are a significant portion of McLane's business. Obviously, increasing the excise burden on products from which my client derives its revenue is damaging to its Kansas business. Engendering the growth of Kansas business is of the utmost importance to building our economy. Imposing increased excise taxes on products that Kansas citizens lawfully sell in this state is not the answer to solving the problem of looming state budget deficits. Increasing excise taxes only increases the economic prospects of our neighboring states.

Mr. Chairman and members, I am also responsible for delivering to the Committee, for its consideration, the written testimony of the Presidents of Kansas Candy & Tobacco and Wichita Tobacco and Candy Company. Both of these wholesale businesses are family owned, relatively small, Kansas employers which will suffer direct harm if HB 2306 is enacted. Hopefully, the written testimony that these two Kansas wholesalers have submitted is self-explanatory.

Indeed, all participants in the alcoholic beverage and tobacco product supply chain, from growers and distillers to distributers and retailers, will be harmed by such a targeted economic burden.

I thank the Committee for the opportunity to submit this testimony.
