Chairman Proehl opened the hearing on **SB127**.

Hearing on: SB127 — Requiring payment prior to installation of commemorative road naming signs.

Staff explained <u>SB127</u> would require the Secretary of Transportation before placing any signs commemoratively designating any highway, bridge, interchange, or trail, to receive sufficient money from gifts and donations to cover the costs of placing such signs plus an additional 50 percent of the initial cost to defray future maintenance or replacement costs. <u>SB127</u> also would designate three portions of highway: The 2nd Lieutenant Justin L Sisson Memorial Highway, The George Ablah Expressway and the Kenneth W. Bernard Memorial Highway.

Staff also presented a technical amendment changing the wording from "markers" to "highway sign."

The Chairman drew the Committee's attention to the written testimony submitted in support of <u>SB127</u> by Senator Michael O'Donnell, (<u>Attachment 1</u>) Senator Mike Petersen (<u>Attachment 2</u>) and Eric Nichol, State Signing Engineer, KDOT. (<u>Attachment 3</u>)

There were no other proponents and no opponents so the Chairman closed the hearing on **SB127**.

The Chairman opened the hearing on **SB150**.

<u>Hearing on: SB150 — Allowing corporate officers to appear before the corporation commission for certain fines.</u>

Staff explained that <u>SB150</u> would allow a duly authorized representative of a corporation or an attorney to enter an appearance and represent a motor carrier before the Kansas Corporation Commission if the civil penalty for violation of the applicable statute, KCC order, or KCC motor carrier rule and regulation would be \$500 or less.

Chairman Proehl recognized Mike Hoeme. (Attachment 4) He said after a meeting with involved parties they arrived at wording that they believe provides additional protection to corporations by requiring "a duly authorized representative of the corporation" or an attorney to enter an appearance on behalf of the motor carrier.

The next proponent was Tom Whitaker who said <u>\$B150</u> would allow an authorized representative of a corporation OR counsel for such corporation to represent the corporation before the Kansas Corporation Commission in matters concerning motor carrier civil penalties of \$500 or less. There were no other proponents and no opponents so the Chairman closed the hearing on **SB150**.

<u>Final action on: SB21 — Regulation and safety requirements for private motor carriers.</u>
Staff explained the bill. There were no questions from the Committee. <u>Representative Ryckman moved</u> to favorably pass **SB21**, seconded by Representative Lusker. The Motion Carried.

Final action on: SB43 — Home on the range highway.

Staff explained the bill. <u>Representative Ryckman moved to favorably pass **SB43** and asked that it be placed on the Consent Calendar. The Motion was seconded by Representative Lusker and the Motion carried.</u>

<u>Final action on: SB72 — Operation of transit buses on certain right shoulders in Wyandotte</u> County.

Staff explained the bill. <u>Representative Ryckman moved to favorably pass **SB72** seconded by Representative Rooker and the Motion carried.</u>
