Hearing on: SB48 — Sunset of property tax exemption for new qualifying pipeline property and retention of exemption for existing exemptions.

Adam Siebers briefed the Committee on this bill introduced by the Ways and Means Committee which removes the property tax exemption for pipeline property.

Randall Allen testified in support of **SB48**. (Attachment 1) He said this bill would have a positive impact on state and county revenues.

Jim Zakoura presented testimony in favor of <u>SB48</u>. (<u>Attachment 2</u>) He stated that current legislation to incent pipeline construction is too broad and needs legislative policy direction to advance Kansas interests. Mr. Zakoura said that legislative support is needed for new pipeline infrastructure in Kansas. He said that he sees this as an economic development issue, not a tax issue. He took questions from the Committee.

Ron Gaches spoke in opposition to **SB48**. (Attachment 3) Mr. Gaches also stated that the pipelines that feed the natural gas liquids facilities and crude oil refineries are vital to future growth.

Michael Gillaspie testified in opposition to **SB48.** (Attachment 4) He said that when their company decides to spend millions of dollars on a project, it takes several years for that project to be finished and this exemption is important for future investment. Mr. Gillaspie took questions from the Committee.
