## **Bill introductions**

Senator Abrams requested the introduction of a bill concerning a sales tax exemption.

There being no objection from any member present, the Chair declared a motion to introduce the bill adopted by consensus.

Chairperson Donovan requested the introduction of the following bills:

- 1. Concerning the elimination of the sales tax exemption on farm machinery and equipment
- 2. Concerning the elimination of the property tax exemption from statewide school levy for residential property to the extent of \$20,000 of its appraised value
- 3. Concerning the elimination of the property tax exemption for property used to generate electricity utilizing wind technology or renewable energy
- 4. Concerning the elimination of the sales tax exemption on sales of water, electricity, heat and other fuels for production of heat and lighting for residential premises and agricultural use

for Homestead assistance regardless of their federal benefits. (Attachment 1)

Richard Cram, Director, Policy and Research, Kansas Department of Revenue (KDOR) answered questions regarding this bill. He said that the current law already provides that "veterans disability payments" are not included in "income". Mr. Cram said that **SB238** provides clarification only because the KDOR interprets the current definition as already excluding service-connected disability payments received from the Department of Veterans Affairs. He distributed copies of the general information for filing a Homestead refund. (Attachment 2)
