Possible bill introductions

Senator Abrams requested the introduction of a bill regarding education. <u>There being no objection from</u> any member present, the Chair declared a motion to introduce the bill adopted by consensus.

<u>Informational hearing: SB332 — Sales tax exemption for the Kansas DUI impact center, inc.</u>

Chairperson Donovan opened the informational hearing on **SB332**.

Senator Faust-Goudeau spoke in favor of <u>SB332</u> because she was so impressed by the services provided by the Kansas DUI Impact Center to families who have lost loved ones because of drunk drivers. (<u>Attachment 1</u>)

Andrie Krahl testified in favor of **SB332** noting that the Center had provided nearly 2,000 DUI victim services in 2015 and over 50,000 since its inception in 1987. (Attachment 2)

Rex Pawlak provided testimony in favor of <u>SB332</u>. He has personally experienced the value of the services of the Center when he lost his son due to an impaired driving crash. (<u>Attachment 3</u>)
