## **Presentation on:**

Chairperson Lynn recognized Hugh Khan, Vice President of Engineering, Perceptive Software, who provided a presentation on the Profile of the Future of Employee. (Attachment 1)

Mr. Khan's presentation included information on corporate strategy, culture, structure, process and people. He indicated people are the most important aspect. He stated every employee needs to know and believe in the core purpose of the corporation's existence.
