



 - State and County level data






QCEW

- · Uses UI tax data
- · Highly reliable and useful
- Around 6-month lag-time






Kansas Labor Report December 2014

- 2,300 private sector jobs added over the month
- · November estimates revised upward
- Labor force increased by 3,531 individuals
- # of individuals receiving unemployment decreased by 9,000 over the year.
