Possible bill introductions

Hearing continuation on: SB342 — Creating the student online personal protection act. Chairperson Abrams opened the continuation of the hearing on SB342. Lisa Heusers testified in opposition stating that student personal property is not being protected since "educational purposes" are determined by the schools or state/federal agencies or companies and not the parents. Furthermore, parents are neither required to grant permission for the release of any student information nor are there procedures that allow the student to opt out of any release of information to outside sources. Ms. Heusers then answered questions from committee members.

Chairperson Abrams then asked if there were additional opponents who wished to testify. There were none.
