<u>Hearing on: SB79 — Electronic publication of propositions to amend the constitution.</u>

Chairman Holmes opened the hearing on **SB79**.

Kris Kobach, Kansas Secretary of State, testified in support of **SB79**. This legislation was proposed because of the expense of the three-time publication requirement. (Attachment 1) He presented the committee data about the fiscal impact of proposed Constitutional amendments in 2015. (Attachment 2) Questions from the committee were addressed by Secretary Kobach.

Richard Gannon, on behalf of Doug Anstaett for the Kansas Press Association, testified in opposition to **SB79**. His concerns are about notification to the people of the state of Kansas when proposing amendments to the state constitution. (Attachment 3)
