<u>Hearing on: HB2558 — Regulation of election campaign workers.</u>

Chairman Holmes opened the hearing on <u>HB2558</u>. Staff gave an overview of the bill and stood for questions.

Proponents:

Representative Keith Esau testified in support of <u>HB2558.(Attachment 1)</u> Representative Esau brought this bill before the house to make clear that local ordinances relating to solicitation do apply to political campaign activity. He stood for questions.

John Anderson, Prairie Village, Kansas, appeared before the committee in support of <u>HB2558</u>. (Attachment 2) Mr. Anderson stated that the idea of restricting an individual seeking an elected office the opportunity to share his or her thoughts and feelings was unfathomable. A local government should not have the authority to override the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.

Mike Jones, Overland Park, Kansas, testified in support of HB2558. (Attachment 3) Mr. Jones said the First Amendment clearly prohibits the making of any laws that abridge the freedom of speech. A Yale University study determined that personal contact at the door from campaigns was the most effective at increasing voter turnout.

Greg Smith, Senator from the 21st District, submitted written testimony in support of <u>HB2258</u>. (Attachment 4)
