The Report of the Joint Committee on Kansas Security to the 2015 Kansas Legislature

Conclusions and Recommendations states "The Joint Committee recommends the state amend
law as necessary so the state adheres to federal guidelines regarding in state tuition for
veterans."

Section 702 of Federal Legislation, known as the Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act of 2014 ("Choice Act"), requires VA to disapprove programs of education for payment of benefits under the Post-9/11 GI Bill and Montgomery GI Bill – Active Duty at public institutions of higher learning if those schools charge <u>qualifying Veterans</u> and <u>dependents</u> tuition and fees in excess of the rate for resident students for terms beginning after July 1, 2015.

This bill is supported by all the major veterans' service organizations. HB 2228 passed the House in order to be in compliant with Federal Law and because of the potential loss of \$104 million in benefits to our veterans.

In conclusion, I would personally like to thank the men and women of our armed forces for their service and sacrifice to our country.
