Hearing on: SB240 — State banking code and the state banking commissioner.

Senator Longbine opened the hearing on SB 240. Eileen Ma gave an organizational overview of the bill

Dustin Kirk, a staff attorney with the Office of the State Bank Commissioner, testified in support of **SB 240**. The last large overhaul of the state banking code was in 1999 while the last whole-scale recodification was done in 1975.

This bill is the culmination of a decade-long deliberative process reflecting a review of the existing statutes in the banking code. Starting in October, 2012, the OSBC understood the current effort. Through partnership between the regulators and industry leaders, the OSBC, the Kansas Bankers Association and the Community Bankers Association, reviewed all 209 statutes of the banking code. The result was **SB 240**.

The goal of the project has been to update, clarify and thin down or eliminate antiquated language and unnecessary statutory provisions. (Attachment 1)

A total of 56 statutes were recommended for repeal. 36 statutes are being recodified into new or existing statutes. 6 are being repealed because they are duplicative thus nothing is being taken away. 14 are being sought for repeal as deemed unnecessary. 18 Special Orders are being added to existing or new statutes. (Attachment 2)
