Approval of Committee Minutes

Bill introductions

Chair Longbine asked if any bill introductions. There were none.

Hearing on:

Chair Longbine opened the hearing on SB370.

Proponent

Eric Smith spoke in favor of <u>SB370</u> on behalf of the League of Kansas Municipalities. Mr. Smith stated concerns raised that if the seismic activity the state has been experiencing resulted in a building being heavily damaged, the current statutes would not provide any protection to the city. The intent of this bill is to extend the time for a municipality to either release the lien or start legal proceeding and also to expand this process to apply to any cause as long as there is insurance coverage for the structure. Mr. Smith responded to questions from the Committee members.

Clark Shultz spoke in favor of **SB370**. Mr. Shultz stated that this bill would clarify that the governing body of the city would be able to establish by ordinance a procedure regarding insurance payments for

any damage or loss to a building or other structure, removing the specific listing of "fire, explosion, or windstorm. The Department is neutral on the underlying policy contained in this bill and fully supportive of this updated language. We believe the updated language will cover any claim and paid by insurance, any city can make this claim per law and appropriate cleanup, etc is done before money is released. (Attachment 2)
