
Working After Retirement Flowchart

Good to Know

- 1. Senate Bill 299 as introduced. Effective date July 1, 2016.
- **2.** Covered positon is one that is permanent, covered by Social Security and meets minimum hours. (School = 630/year; Nonschool=1,000/year) All other positions are considered "noncovered" for KPERS purposes.
- **3.** The Kansas House is currently has its own version of working after retirement rules, HB 2253 as amended by the House Pensions and Benefits Committee.
