Discussion:

The affect of the fiscal bill for passage would be a neutral impact. The bill applies only to class B and C dams. Water reports are due every five years for Class B, and three years for Class C. The Department of Water Office will do the inspection if it has not been reported by the landowner. The inspection expense is \$1,500; costing less than a private firm. Concerns were expressed over the cost, and consideration is being given to a maximum cap of \$1,500. Class A dams are unjurisdictional.

Chairman Powell turned the Committee's attention to <u>SB425-Authorizing the board of county</u> commissioners of any county to regulate conservation easements on property located within the county.

<u>Senator McGinn moved, Senator Francisco seconded the bill be tabled. Division was called with six in favor, four opposed. The bill was tabled.</u>

Chairman Powell turned the Committee's attention to <u>HB2479-Act concerning agriculture</u>, relating to noxious weeds.

<u>Senator Tyson moved, K.S.A. 2-1314 page 1 (a) (b) page 2 (2) for "control and notification"</u> <u>amendment. Senator Ostmeyer seconded the motion including the conceptual amendment, "right of way." Motion adopted.</u>
