Hearing continuation on: SB254 — Behavioral sciences regulatory board; licensure of professions.

Chairperson Pilcher-Cook continued the hearing on **SB254**.

Stuart Little, KAAP, representing Dulcinea Rakestraw, testified in support of **SB254**. Mr. Little stated that they are supportive of the bill including the addition of the Licensed Masters Addiction Counselor. Mr. Little indicated that they would like to propose an amendment to address the language for the Licensed Masters Addiction Counselor license. Mr. Little described the changes, and indicated that they have not submitted the suggested amendments to the revisor. (Attachment 1)

Cynthia Schendel, KNASW, testified in opposition of <u>SB254</u>. Ms. Schendel stated that KNASW has reviewed <u>SB254</u> and opposes several provisions. Ms. Schendel indicated that they would provide balloon amendments at the appropriate time. Ms. Schendel provided an overview of their concerns and suggested changes to address those issues. Kevin M. Fowler, KNASW Legal Counsel, testified in opposition of <u>SB254</u>. Mr. Fowler addressed two points of concern in Section 11. Mr. Fowler provided some suggested changes to address their concerns. He stated that he believes the Association has separately provided staff with some balloon amendments to accomplish both of these objectives. (<u>Attachment 3</u>)

Final action on: HB2149 — Relating to donor human breast milk.

Chairperson Pilcher-Cook opened final action on **HB2149**.

Senator Denning indicated that there has been an agreement on <u>SB123--Medications used to treat</u> <u>mental illness under the state medicaid program</u>. Nobuko Folmsbee distributed the amendment and explained the changes. (<u>Attachment 5</u>)

Senator Denning moved, Senator Bowers seconded, to add the contents of the amendment known as SB123 New Language into HB2149. After some discussion, motion carried.

<u>Senator Denning moved, Senator LaTurner seconded, to add the contents of **SB181--Medicaid**; <u>restrictions of prescription-only drugs</u>, as amended by the Committee of the Whole, into **HB2149**. After some discussion, motion carried.</u>

<u>Senator Denning moved, Senator Kelly seconded, to create **S Sub for HB2149** and recommend favorably for passage. Motion carried.</u>

<u>Final action on: HB2225 — Medical retainer agreements do not constitute insurance.</u> Chairperson Pilcher-Cook opened final action on **HB2225**. Nobuko Folmsbee reviewed the bill.

Senator Denning moved, Senator LaTurner seconded, to add the contents of SB285--Healing arts licensees, resident active licenses and health care records into HB2225. Motion carried.

Senator O'Donnell distributed a balloon amendment, and explained the changes. (Attachment 6)

<u>Senator Denning moves, Senator Kelly seconded, to add the contents of SB180--Health maintenance</u> <u>organizations and medicare provider organizations; privilege fees, as amended by the Committee of the Whole, into HB2281. Motion carried.</u>

<u>Senator Denning moved, Senator Holmes seconded, to create **S Sub for HB2281** and recommend favorably for passage. Motion carried.</u>
