<u>Hearing on: SB465 — Use of certain controlled substances to treat binge eating authorized.</u> Chairperson O'Donnell opened the hearing on <u>SB465</u>. Scott Abbott, staff revisor, presented a briefing on the bill.

Ron Hein testified in support of <u>SB465</u> on behalf of Shire who is the manufacturer of Vyvanse. Mr. Hein stated that Vyvanse was approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in January 2015. Mr. Hein indicated that although the FDA approved it, legislation is needed that would enable physicians in Kansas to be able to treat Binge Eating Disorders (BED) in adults in the state. Ted Buckley, Shire, testified in support of <u>SB465</u>. Mr. Buckley expounded upon the necessity of <u>SB465</u> to ensure adult patients with moderate to severe BED have uninterrupted access to treatment; and, that physicians are never liable for prescribing within the bounds approved by the FDA. Mr. Buckley indicated that Vyvanse is the first and only FDA approved treatment for adult patients with moderate to severe BED. (Attachment 2)
