Pew's Rainy Day Fund Criteria




Dedicated fund with enabling legislation

Operation across fiscal years and over the whole economic cycle

Serves as a government-wide reserve for general purposes







Why Create a Rainy Day Fund for Kansas?



Purpose driven savings


 Creates guidelines or rules that are distinct from those for a general fund

 Establishing an evidence-based rainy day fund sends a clear positive signal to credit rating agencies

Why Does Volatility Matter?

 Influences timing and size of state budget surpluses and shortfalls


- Unpredictability confounds best efforts to craft and execute balanced budgets
- Smoothing volatility across the business cycle can lessen need for short-term budget fixes



Virginia saves based on revenue growth




Saving when revenues are above-average

Establish a rainy day fund with a clear purpose


Connect deposits to revenue volatility
