AN ACT establishing the school district interlocal cooperation for the sharing of administrative staff grant program.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. There is established the school district interlocal cooperation for the sharing of administrative staff grant program. The purpose of the program is to reward school districts that enter into interlocal cooperation agreements in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 72-8230, and amendments thereto, for the purpose of jointly and cooperatively sharing the services of a superintendent of schools and assistant superintendents appointed under authority of K.S.A. 72-8202b, and amendments thereto. Each school district that enters into such an interlocal cooperation agreement is entitled to receive a grant of state moneys in an amount to be computed by the state board of education as follows:

(a) Determine the total amount budgeted in the school year preceding the school year in which the interlocal cooperation agreement is entered by the school districts party to the agreement for the salaries of the superintendents and assistant superintendents employed by such school districts;

(b) determine the amount budgeted under the interlocal cooperation agreement for the salaries of the jointly shared superintendent and assistant superintendents;

(c) subtract the amount determined under (b) from the amount determined under (a);

(d) divide the remainder obtained under (c) by the number of school districts party to the interlocal cooperation agreement. The amount of the quotient is the amount of the grant each school district is entitled to receive for the school year and for the two next succeeding school years. Upon receipt of a grant of state moneys under this section, the amount of the grant shall be deposited in or credited to any program weighted fund or any categorical fund of the district.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
