10 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending
11 June 30, 2002, and June 30, 2003; authorizing certain transfers and
12 fees, imposing certain restrictions and limitations and directing or au-
13 thORIZING certain receipts, disbursements, capital improvements and
14 acts incidental to the foregoing.

15
16 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

17 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2002, and June 30,
18 2003, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are
19 hereby imposed, and transfers, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts in-
20 cidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided
21 in this act.

22 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate
23 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized
24 by this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to
25 the restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

26 (c) This act shall be known and may be cited as the omnibus appro-
27 priation act of 2002 and shall constitute the omnibus reconciliation spend-
28 ing limit bill for the 2002 regular session of the legislature for purposes
29 of subsection (a) of K.S.A. 75-6702 and amendments thereto.

30 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the
31 provisions of K.S.A. 46- 155 and amendments thereto.

20 made by the department on aging from moneys appropriated from the

22 department on aging as authorized by this or other appropriation act of
23 the 2002 regular session of the legislature, expenditures shall be made by

25 facility reimbursement methodology as published in the Kansas Register:
26 *Provided*, That the secretary of aging shall institute trending methods to
27 provide inflationary increases to nursing facilities until implementation of
28 the published rules and regulations is complete: *Provided further*, That
29 the secretary of aging shall delay the implementation of the published
30 nursing facility reimbursement methodology for six months but for not
31 more than 12 months from July 1, 2002: *And provided further*, That the
32 secretary of aging shall present a report to the committee on ways and
33 means of the senate and the committee on appropriations of the house
34 of representatives during the 2003 regular session of the legislature on
35 cost containment alternatives for nursing facility reimbursements for con-
36 sideration prior to publication of the proposed reimbursement rules and
37 regulations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

1 appropriate contracts with mental health centers, that each mental health
2 center include in the current assessment of needs for such mental health
3 center and include in the current plan for the provision of community
4 based mental health services provisions for serving children, parents and
5 families being served by foster care and reintegration contractors and
6 adoption contractors to the extent that mental health services are not
7 required to be provided by the foster care and reintegration services con-
8 tractors and adoption services contractors under the foster care and re-
9 integration services contracts and adoption services contracts with the
10 department of social and rehabilitation services and, if necessary and
11 timely services are not provided by any such mental health center for
12 such children, parents and families, expenditures shall be made by the

20 made by the department of social and rehabilitation services from moneys
21 appropriated from the Larned state hospital fee fund for fiscal year 2003
22 for the department of social and rehabilitation services as authorized by
23 this or other appropriation act of the 2002 regular session of the legisla-
24 ture, expenditures shall be made by the secretary of social and rehabili-
25 tation services for fiscal year 2003 for payment for services provided by
26 central Kansas medical center at the medicaid rate.

27 (g) In addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be
28 made by the department of social and rehabilitation services from moneys
29 appropriated from the state general fund or any special revenue fund for
30 fiscal year 2003 for the department of social and rehabilitation services
31 as authorized by this or other appropriation act of the 2002 regular session
32 of the legislature, expenditures shall be made by the secretary of social
33 and rehabilitation services for fiscal year 2003 to fix, charge and collect
34 fees from parents for services provided to their children by an institution
35 or program of the department of social and rehabilitation services: *Pro-*
36 *vided*, That, in accordance with the provisions of federal law, the secretary
37 of social and rehabilitation services shall not deny services to children
38 under the home and community based services programs or the family
39 preservation program based on the failure of any parent to pay such fees:
40 *Provided further*, That such fees shall be fixed by adoption of a sliding
41 fee scale established by the secretary of social and rehabilitation services
42 based on recommendations made by a working group including employ-
43 ees of the department, representatives of stakeholder organizations and

1 family members and such fees shall take into consideration the parents'
2 income and ability to pay, shall be reasonable and shall be fixed in order
3 to recover all or part of the expenses incurred in providing such services:
4 *And provided further*, That such fees shall be waived in cases of demon-
5 strable hardship and for families at or below 200% of the federal poverty
6 level who are receiving home and community based services or family
7 preservation services: *And provided further*, That the secretary of social
8 and rehabilitation services shall prepare and deliver a letter to the parents
9 of every child who is receiving such services to express the need for pay-
10 ment of such fees to be made to the extent of their financial ability to do
11 so: *And provided further*, That all moneys received by the department of
12 social and rehabilitation services for such fees shall be deposited in the
13 state treasury to the credit of the social welfare fund: *And provided fur-*
14 *ther*, That, at the beginning of the 2003 regular session of the legislature,
15 the secretary of social and rehabilitation services shall submit a report to
16 the committee on appropriations of the house of representatives, the
17 committee on ways and means of the senate and to other appropriate
18 standing and joint committees of the legislature on the status and the
19 results of the fees collection program.

39 the director of accounts and reports shall transfer \$250,000 from the
40 central administration operations and parole and postrelease supervision
41 operations account of the state general fund to the treatment and pro-
42 grams account of the state general fund: *Provided*, That such amount of
43 \$250,000 shall be expended for fiscal year 2003 by the department of

1 corrections from the treatment and programs account of the state general
2 fund to fund substance abuse treatment in the facilities, which shall be
3 in addition to any other expenditures the department of corrections al-
4 locates for such purpose.

34 59(a) of chapter 144 of the 2001 Session Laws of Kansas from the state
35 general fund in the debt service payment for the revenue refunding bond
