SB 88, An act concerning children; relating to permanency; priority of certain orders; amending K.S.A. 38-1116, 60-3103 and 60-3107 and K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 38-1121, 38-2201, 38-2202, 38-2203, 38-2208, 38-2212, 38-2242, 38-2243, 38-2251, 38-2255, 38-2258, 38-2264, 38-2272, 38-2279, 38-2304, 38-2305, 38-2344, 38-2357, 38-2364, 38-2365, 38-2373 and 60-1610 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Judiciary.

SB 89, An act relating to workers compensation; concerning certain records; amending K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 44-550b and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Financial Institutions and Insurance.
