

MINUTES OF MEETING
STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE
April 4, 1961

The meeting was called to order and Mr. Clifford Fawl was introduced to discuss S.B. 229, the barber bill. He stated that this is different from the other bill in that it specifies certain things about the licensing of barbers, the cost, and the cost of licensing schools. Mr. Fawl states that these are the major differences between 229 and 177.

There was considerable discussion concerning this proposal and Mr. Fawl was asked to explain the difference between an apprentice barber, and a journeyman barber, and a master barber. Mr. Fawl explained that there is a Master Barbers' Association on the national, state and local level; that he himself is president of the state association; that to be a master barber doesn't necessarily mean that you are affiliated with a union; that in fact he is not and does not operate a union shop.

Thereupon, it was moved by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Mr. Fribley and unanimously passed that S.B. 229 be passed out favorably.
