Minutes of Meeting

February 1, 1961

Meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Senator Lauterbach, at 10:00 A.M., with all members present except Senators Doty and Hults.

Senator Harper made a motion that House Bill #33 be recommended for passage, seconded by Senator Warren. Motion carried unanimously.

Senator Sanborn made a report on the trips the committee members took on Jan. 30 and 31. On Jan. 30 Senators Ward, Doty, Warren, VanSickle and Sanborn visited the state penitentiary at Lansing. On Jan. 31, Senators Lauterbach, Sanborn, VanSickle, Ward, and Warren visited the school for the blind and the medical center in Kansas City, and the school for the deaf in Olathe. Mrs. Mildred LeSuer from the budget department accompanied the committee on both days.

An invitation from Chancellor Clarke Wescoe was extended to the committee, inviting the Ways and Means Committee members of both the Senate and House to visit the campus, have dinner, and attend the basketball game with the University of Missouri, on Monday, February 13.

The committee will start hearings by the various agencies beginning Thursday, February 2.
