

SENATE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Minutes of the Meeting  
January 10, 1962

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lauterbach at 9:00 a.m. on January 10, 1962. All the members were present.

Col. Guy C. Rexroad, Theodore L. Heim, Pat Brazle and Loren Burnett appeared before the committee on behalf of the budget of the Director of Penal Institutions. A copy of the request as presented by Col. Rexroad is attached. In addition to the items listed in the attached report, restoration was asked for the following items:

1. \$1,200 to be used to send two employees to Washington, D. C.
2. A chemist to work in the soap factory
3. \$1,500 for an additional ball mill for the paint factory
4. A tailor to work in the clothing factory
5. \$37,000 to be used to move storage tanks now located in the Oklahoma Jail and also remodel a portion of the jail

Mr. Joseph Schletzbaum appeared before the committee on behalf of the Reception and Diagnostic Center. A supplemental appropriation of \$44,000 was requested to allow the agency to complete the remodeling of the institution. The amount of \$12,000 was requested for the remodeling of the four houses transferred to the center by the State Executive Council. It was also requested that a revolving fund be established in the amount of \$1,000 which would be used for the pay of inmates.

Senator Smith made a motion, seconded by Senator Harper, that the drafted bill that makes appropriations to the Atomic Energy Advisory Council, Kansas Judges Retirement Board, State Library, Traveling Library Commission, Adjutant General and the State Brand Commissioner be introduced as a committee bill. The motion carried. (Senate Bill No. 7)

The meeting recessed at 10:00 a.m. and reconvened at 2:00 p.m. John Munns appeared before the committee on behalf of the budget of the Kansas State Industrial Reformatory. Restoration of the following items was requested:

1. Commodities and contractual services to the agency's original request.
2. \$30,000 to be used for remodeling the administration building and construction of a resident for the superintendent
3. \$10,000 for road repairs

Mr. Sherman H. Crouse appeared before the committee on behalf of the budget of the Kansas State Penitentiary. A copy of the requests as presented by Mr. Crouse is attached.

Mrs. Daisy Sharpe appeared before the committee on behalf of the budget of the Industrial Farm for Women. A copy of the requests as presented by Mrs. Sharpe is attached.

The meeting adjourned at 4:00 p.m.
