

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Minutes

The thirteenth meeting of the Education Committee convened at 3:00 P.M., Monday afternoon, February 18, 1963 in Room 522 with Chairman Bower presiding. All the members were present except Messrs. Dreiling, Tillotson and Teter. Mr. McCall had been previously excused.

HOUSE BILL No. 149:

Mr. Nesmith reported to the members on House Bill No. 149 explaining that its purpose was to repeal the law since this law was not needed. He introduced Superintendent of Public Instruction Throckmorton who explained that if a majority of an area wanted to be attached they could appeal by petition to the Board subject to the approval of the County Superintendent and the State Superintendent. He felt it was inequitable that a district could take in an outlying territory.

The motion was made by Mr. Nesmith, seconded by Mr. Finney, that House Bill No. 149 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

HOUSE BILL NO. 163:

Mr. Nesmith explained House Bill No. 163 to the members relating that he had talked to the Attorney General's office and they suggested that an amendment be added similar to the pauper's affidavit which provides for very poor people and makes the bill constitutional.

The motion was made by Mr. Nesmith, seconded by Mr. Hughes, that the Committee recommend House Bill No. 163 be amended and adopted by the Committee. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Nesmith made the motion, seconded by Mr. Hughes, that the Committee recommend House Bill No. 163 as amended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

Representative W. R. Brown, Jr. reported to the members on House Bill No. 164 suggesting an amendment in Section 1, Line 11.

Representative Brown also reported to the members on House Bill No. 165.

HOUSE BILL No. 164:

Mr. Harder made the motion, seconded by Mr. Smith, that House Bill No. 164 be amended. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Casado made the motion, seconded by Mr. Hughes, that House Bill No. 164 be recommended favorably for passage as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

HOUSE BILL No. 165:

The motion was made by Mr. Hughes, seconded by Mr. Harder, that House Bill No. 165 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Finney made the motion that the Committee adopt the principle of three options that the planning board can adopt in House Bill No. 233. The motion carried unanimously.

Upon motion of Mr. Nesmith, the meeting adjourned at 4:00 P.M.
