

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Minutes

The twenty-first meeting of the Education Committee convened at 11:55 A.M., Friday, March 1, 1963 in Room 502 with Chairman Bower presiding. All the members were present except: Messrs. Dreiling, and Teter. Mr. Robinson had been excused.

The meeting was called for the purpose of finishing work on House Bill No. 233 on school district unification.

Mr. Fred Carman of the Bill Drafting Department met with the Committee.

The members started with Section 10 subsection C.

Mr. Dixon made the motion, seconded by Mr. McCall, that the following subsection C be adopted by the Committee:

(C) Each proposed unified district shall have an expected enrollment of at least seven hundred fifty (750) students in its schools in grades one through twelve on the first September 15 after the effective date of organization of such district with the following exceptions and further specifications, to wit: (1) Any planning unit, having an expected enrollment of less than three thousand seven hundred fifty (3,750) such students, may have one, two, three or four unified districts, even if one or more of such districts has an expected enrollment of less than seven hundred fifty (750) such students.

(2) Where there are more than three thousand seven hundred forty-nine (3,749) such students in a planning unit, no unified dis-

trict shall have less than seven hundred fifty (750) such students.

(3) Careful consideration shall be given to the grade and curriculum requirements of section 21 of this act, and no unified district shall be proposed in which it would be manifestly impracticable to maintain, offer and teach the grades and units of instruction as specified in said section 21.

The motion carried unanimously.

Moratorium section -- Section 15. Mr. McCall made the motion, seconded by Mr. Vogel, that the Committee adopt the revised Section 15. The motion carried unanimously.

Section 9, lines 21 and 22 were discussed and new wording suggested by Mr. Carman. Mr. Edwards made the motion, seconded by Mr. Nesmith, that this be adopted and inserted in Section 9. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Carman suggested that Section 24 be added. Mr. Smith made the motion, seconded by Mr. McCall, that this section be adopted. The motion carried by a vote of 12 for and one against.

Mr. Smith made the motion, seconded by Mr. Casado, that the revised bill be introduced as a Committee bill and recommended for passage. The motion carried with a vote of eleven for and none against.

The meeting adjourned at 12:25 P.M.
