

House Judiciary Committee Meeting  
Friday, February 1, 1963

The House Judiciary Committee met Friday, February 1, 1963, in Room 523 at 9:30 A.M. with Chairman Clyde Hill presiding. Ten members were present. Members Arthur, Briggs, Davis, Gardner, Krug, Malone, Smith, Tillotson, Van Cleave and Williams were absent.

Chairman Hill called the meeting to order.

Mr. Skoog moved that House Bill No. 12, An Act relating to terms of the district court of the thirty-fourth judicial district; amending section 20-1030 of the General Statutes of 1949, and repealing said original section, be recommended for passage. Mr. Crossan seconded. Chairman Hill asked for any discussion. There was none. Motion carried, unanimously.

Mr. Liebert moved that House Bill No. 65, An Act relating to certain powers, compensation and expenses of the marshal of the court of Coffeyville, amending section 20-1606 of the General Statutes Supplement of 1961, and repealing said original section, be recommended for passage. Mr. Crossan seconded. Chairman Hill asked for any discussion. There was none. Motion carried, unanimously.

Mr. Crossan moved that House Bill No. 66, An Act relating to city courts in certain second class cities and relating to certain powers, compensation and expenses of the marshal of such courts, amending sections 20-2401 and 20-2407 of the General Statutes Supplement of 1961, and repealing said original sections, be recommended for passage. Mr. Liebert seconded. Chairman Hill asked for any discussion. There was none. Motion carried, unanimously.

Mr. Liebert moved that House Bill No. 70, An Act empowering the probate and juvenile judge in Montgomery county to hold court in the cities of Coffeyville and Independence, and providing for his compensation therefor, be recommended for passage. Mr. Crossan seconded. Chairman Hill called for any discussion. Mr. Griffith asked if he is prohibited from practice. Mr. Crossan explained the limitations. There was no further discussion. Motion carried, unanimously.

Mr. Skoog moved that House Bill No. 75, An Act relating to district courts in certain judicial districts, prescribing certain rights, authority, powers and duties, amending section 20-709 of the General Statutes of 1949, and repealing said original section, be recommended for passage. Mr. Liebert seconded. Chairman Hill asked for any discussion. There was none. Motion carried, unanimously.

Mr. Skoog moved that Chairman Hill's proposed bills, a curative act relating to tax foreclosure and an act relating to notary publics, be introduced. Mr. Liebert seconded. Chairman Hill asked for any discussion. There was none. Motion carried, unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 9:50 A.M. The next regular meeting will be announced.
