

STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

February 4, 1963

The meeting was called to order and the Chairman introduced Mr. Don Smith of Colby, who discussed H.B. 69, a local bill concerning only Colby. He explained in detail what the measure proposed to do; that it has the blessing of the College (experiment station), the city of Colby, the highway department and Colby Developers; that the experiment station is the only one that could possibly suffer, and they have stated they are happy with this arrangement.

It was moved by Mr. Ford, seconded by Mr. Gardner and unanimously carried that H.B. 69 be passed out favorably.

The Chairman then stated that the Committee was ready to consider H.B. 11; that an amendment had been previously offered and adopted; that there was correspondence clearing up rumored objections to the bill. Thereupon, it was moved by Mr. Ford, seconded by Mr. Marshall and unanimously carried that H.B. 11 as amended, be recommended favorably.

H. B. 72 was then discussed, with Mr. Doyen offering an amendment. Mr. Doyen moved, seconded by Mr. Ford and carried with two members passing, that the amendment be adopted. It was then moved by Mr. Doyen, seconded by Mr. Ford and unanimously carried that the bill be passed out favorably.
