

STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

March 14, 1963

The meeting was called to order and Mr. Behee introduced guests from St. Mary's College in Leavenworth.

Mr. Riddle asked to discuss H.B. 301, stating that it was not drafted as he had intended, and asked that it be recommended adversely. Motion was seconded by Mr. Unruh and carried unanimously.

Discussion was resumed on H.B. 430, and Mr. Unruh explained the answers to his questions of yesterday. He stated that this bill would remove the requirement for a chattel mortgage on each account (of a single individual) and permit a revolving type of account with only one mortgage. Thereupon, Mr. Doyen moved that the bill be recommended favorably, as amended. Motion was seconded by Mr. Fribley and carried unanimously.

Mr. Fribley asked the reconsideration of H.B. 260, stating that in the "talking stage" this was a proposal to establish a Youth Division, not an "Authority", and that if taken off the table, this would be removed, along with the need for a budget, and simply allow for coordination. Mr. Unruh stated that although they might permit this now, it wouldn't be long until they were asking for a budget. Mr. Baringer asked to be on record as favoring such an establishment; that the urban areas apparently needed it more than rural areas. Mr. Riddle stated that in his county, these things are taken care of locally. Mr. Behee moved to bring HB 260 off the table, and the motion was seconded by Mr. Wallace. Motion lost with a vote of 6 yes and 9 no.

Meeting was adjourned.
