SENATE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Minutes of the Meeting March 4, 1963

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lauterbach at 10:00 a.m., March 4, 1963, with all members present except Senators Hults and Saar.

The Chairman stated that the Post Audit Department has recommended that a revolving fund be established for the University of Kansas Medical Center to allow mainly for the payment of costs of indigent patients (which are reimburseable by welfare departments) and other costs of the Center. Senator Sanborn moved that a Committee bill be introduced establishing and appropriating \$10,000 to a revolving fund for the Medical Center and appropriating moneys to other revolving funds already established for other State agencies. Senator Warren seconded the motion. Motion carried. (See Attachment No. 1.)

Senator Smith presented the subcommittee report concerning appropriations to the institutions of higher education under the control of the Board of Regents. (See Attachment No. 2.) Senator Smith moved, and Senator Glades seconded the motion, that the subcommittee's report on the institutions be approved and a committee bill introduced implementing the recommendations.

Senator Farmer made a substitute motion to approve the subcommittee's report with the addition of a \$10,000 appropriation to the University of Kansas for Peace Officers Training. Senator Harper seconded the motion. Motion failed.

Vote was then taken on Senator Smith's motion; and the motion carried. (See Attachments Nos. 3 and 4.)

Meeting adjourned at 11:15 a.m.

SENATE BILL No. 358

By Committee on Ways and Means

AN ACT providing for a revolving fund for the university of Kansas medical center and making transfer thereto; amending section 76-2601 of the General Statutes Supplement of 1961, as amended by section 1, chapter 42, Laws of the Budget Session, 1962, and repealing said original sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. Section 76-2601 of the General Statutes Sup-2 plement of 1961 as amended by section 1, chapter 42, Laws of 3 the Budget Session, 1962, is hereby amended to read as follows: 4 Sec. 76-2601. The following revolving funds now in existence 5 are hereby declared to be permanent and the following revolv-6 ing funds which are not now in existence are hereby established; 7 and shall remain in the hands of the officers of the following 8 spending agencies in the amounts herein set out to be used as 9 provided by law:

SEC. 2. On July 1, 1963, the state controller is hereby au-2 thorized and directed to transfer the sum of ten thousand dollars 3 (\$10,000) from the state general revenue fund to the univer-4 sity of Kansas medical center revolving fund. Upon making 5 said transfer, the state controller shall notify the state treasurer 6 and the dean of the university of Kansas medical center who 7 shall make the proper entries in the records of their respective 8 offices.

SEC. 3. Section 76-2601 of the General Statutes Supplement 2 of 1961, as amended by section 1, chapter 42, Laws of the 3 Budget Session, 1962, is hereby repealed.

SENATE COLLITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

Subcommittee Report

Institutions of Higher Education

The Board of Regents, at its meeting on January 18, 1963, increased the per semester undergraduate incidental fees at the two universities and the three colleges by \$15 for residents students and by \$25 for non-resident students, to be effective the fall semester of the 1963-64 school year. At the meeting on February 15, 1963, the Board of Regents increased fees for graduate students during regular sessions by \$15 per semester for resident students and \$25 per semester for non-resident students and also approved summer session fees at all institutions on a semester credit hour basis as follows:

- \$6 per semester credit hour for residents (graduate and undergraduate)
- \$10 per semester credit hour for non-resident graduate students
- \$19 per semester credit hour for non-resident undergraduate students.

The Governor, in funding the budgets of the colleges and universities, used preliminary estimates of collections to be made through increased fees. The colleges have now submitted revisions based on the approved fee schedules and your sub-committee recommends the following changes from the Governor's budget funding because of the fee revisions:

Increases from the Governor's Budget for supenditures from the General Revenue Fund are recommended for the following two items:

- (1) In FY 1964 an additional \$2.817 to restore one of two deleted Clerk Stemographers I positions to the budget of the University of Kansas.
- (2) In FY 1963 an additional \$600 to provide supplemental retirement benefits for retirees at Kansas State College, Pittsburg, who were not included in the original 1963 list of retirees.

It is recommended that the Mays and Means Committee approve for passage Senate Bill No. 302, which appropriates \$650,000 from the General Revenue Fund "to construct and equip D laboratory building" at the University of Kanses, Medical Center.

Changes in the appropriations from the Eansas Educational Building Fund as shown in the Governor's Budget are recommended as follows:

This change was made necessary when it was decided that Kansas State University would not build additional power generating facilities as originally set out in the long range building program. It is understood that equipment, such as seats, stage curtains and stage equipment will be included in K.E.B.F. requests to be appropriated

after fiscal 1965.

University of Kansas Medical Center

To construct and squip "D" laboratory building \$ (200,000) \$ (800,000)

This building is provided in SB 502 (Wunsch) by appropriating \$650,000 from the General Revenue Fund for FY 1964 with the understanding that the additional \$650,000 required for the total project cost may be provided by federal funds.

University of Kansas Gymnasium (first phase)

\$ 1,000,000

This building was requested by the Board of Regents as a part of its 2-year building program to be financed from the Educational Building Fund. In the Governor's Budget, the "D" laboratory was recommended as a substitute item for the symmetium. However, with the introduction of SB 502 providing financing of the "D" building with General Revenue and federal funds, the resources in the Educational Building Fund are now made available for the symmetium as indicated above.

The following provises to be included in appropriations are recommended as additions to the Governor's recommended appropriation bill text in the Educational Building Fund:

- (1) For Fort Hays Kansas State College, a provise in the appropriation for a library: "Provided. That funds from this appropriation shall be available to pay the library's share of the cost of the utility tunnels and utilities which must be built and installed to service both the New Library and the Speech and Music Center."
- (2) For Kenses State Teachers College, Emporia, a provise in the appropriation for the Humanities Building: "Provided, That expenditures may be made from this account to raze the old Butcher School Building."
- (3) For the University of Kansas, a provise in the appropriation to replace Fraser Hall: "Provided. That if in the opinion of the state architect it becomes desirable to combine a portion of the mechanical equipment for Fraser Hall with similar equipment in the Blake Hall replacement building, this appropriation may share proportionately in the cost.
- (4) For Kanses State College, Pittsburg, add the words "and equip" to the appropriation for remodeling Carney Hall.

It is recommended that appropriations to the Board of Regents be approved as shown in the appropriation bill text shown in the Governor's budget on page 306. However, this Committee recommends that the positions to be allocated and the salaries for employees in the office of the Board of Regents should be established at the discretion of the Board of Regents without approval by the Finance Council.

Your subcommittee has considered the recommendations of the State Controller relating to the installation of automatic data processing equipment and recommends that although appropriation of one-half year of operation for such installation is included in the budget, the Medical Center should follow the recommendations of the State Controller and delay initiation of the program until completed and tested programs of the present accounting and business office procedures are available for use in the data processing operation.

Dear Senator Lauterbach:

Mr. Max Bickford has requested that I write you a letter explaining the changes which the Regents have recommended in the appropriations to Kansas State University for the forthcoming biennium from the Educational Building Fund.

The Kansas State appropriations recommended in the Governor's Budget Report were as follows:

1. To construct and equip an auditorium 2. To remodel Willard hell FY 1964 \$100,000 \$1,200,000

3. To remodel West Waters hall and Waters annex 200,000

4. Any unencumbered balance as of June 30, 1963, in any of the following accounts is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 1964: physics-mathematics building; agricultural science building; environmental research laboratory; dairy plant and poultry building; unit of physical science building.

5. Any unencumbered balance as of June 30, 1963, in any of the following accounts is hereby lapsed: to remodel veterinary hall; for constructing nuclear laboratory.

Total - Kansas educational building

The changes recommended, as indicated in the table below, were dictated by a policy adopted by the Regents with reference to meeting the increase in the power requirements of the University Physical Plant.

The alternatives open to us were to install additional generators and produce this power ourselves, or purchase the additional power from the Kansas Power and Light Company. The decision was made to follow the latter course. To have purchased and installed new generators would have required approximately a two million dollar capital expenditure during the next ten years.

In order to purchase the additional power from KP&L it is negessary to spend \$70,000 immediately and an additional \$200,000 within the next 24 months for installing the necessary electrical distribution system. Therefore, an allocation of \$70,000 for Kansas State University for the first year of the biennium from the EBF and \$200,000 for the second year of the biennium was requested from the EBF. It is proposed to take this \$270,000 from the \$1,300,000 auditorium allocation.

According to our schedule for the auditorium, we cannot begin construction until the second year of the coming biennium. Furthermore, it has become evident that the \$1,300,000 will not meet minimum costs for an adequate auditorium. Consequently, the Board is requesting that the difference between the \$270,000 for the electrical distribution system and the original allocation of \$1,300,000 for the auditorium, or \$1,030,000 be appropriated for construction of the auditorium minus stage, seats, and electrical equipment. The sum necessary for purchase and installation of seats, stage, and electrical equipment will be requested from the EBF for the 1965-67 biennium. This latter appropriation, of course, will take priority over other buildings in the Kansas State University building program. It will be possible for us to construct the auditorium in this fashion without increasing construction costs or delaying the time when the building will be available for use.

SEC. 21. Appeals to exceed limitation. Total expenditures 2 (including encumbrances) from the special revenue funds 3 listed above for the fiscal year 1964 may not exceed the 4 amounts shown, except upon written application to the governor 5 and approval of the state finance council. Additional au-6 thorized expenditures shall be made from funds in the respective special revenue funds on hand and available, exclusive 8 of that portion credited to the state general revenue fund.

SEC. 22. Reappropriation. Subject to the conditions and 2 limitations of this act, any unencumbered balance as of June 3 30, 1963, in any special revenue fund or funds heretofore appropriated is hereby reappropriated for the same use and purpose as originally appropriated for the ensuing fiscal year 6 ending June 30, 1964.

PART III—MISCELLANEOUS

SEC. 23. Revolving funds. Pursuant to the provisions of 2 sections 2601 and 2606 of chapter 76 of the General Statutes 3 Supplement of 1961, or any amendments thereto, all revolving 4 funds of the agencies named in this act are hereby made avail-5 able to each such agency for the uses and purposes as in such 6 section provided.

SEC. 24. Federal grants. All federal grants and other fed-2 eral receipts are hereby appropriated for the purpose set forth 3 in such federal grant or receipts to the agency of the state re-4 ceiving the same for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964.

SEC. 25. For purposes of computing the contributions to 2 cover the cost of prior service provided in section 74-4925, 3 General Statutes Supplement, 1961, and any amendments 4 thereto, for employees, who are members under the retirement 5 annuity contract authorized by the board of regents the state

6 controller shall apply a rate of 1.52% to the compensation of each 7 employee under said system.

Sec. 26. Fixing of salaries. Except as may be otherwise 2 fixed under the state civil service act or other applicable laws, 3 salaries or wages shall be fixed on an annual basis prior to the 4 beginning of each fiscal year by any state board for employees 5 of institutions under its control, and by elected officials, de-6 partment heads or commissions for their authorized employees. 7 When the salaries or wages have been so fixed the controller 8 of the state department of administration shall be advised in 9 writing and he shall be guided by such advice in passing pay-10 rolls for payment. Changes in such salaries made during the 11 fiscal year shall be reported to the state controller, in writing, 12 for his guidance. Except as otherwise provided by law, each 13 employee of the state shall be paid for the proportion of his 14 annual salary earned each month as of the end of such month 15 and as soon as is practicable after the end of each month.

SEC. 27. Cash basis. In all cases in which appropriations 2 are made by the provisions of this act, the officer or person 3 having charge of such appropriation shall, in no case, by any 4 contract, act or proceeding attempt to obligate the state of 5 Kansas at any time to pay a larger sum or sums than that herein 6 specifically appropriated, and no larger sum or sums shall be 7 audited by the controller of the state department of administra-8 tion for the purposes herein mentioned than are herein appropriated, and in no case shall any appropriation herein pro-10 vided be used for any purpose or purposes except that specifically stated herein; and no officer or employee of the state shall 12 purchase any article or service on the state's credit unless specific 13 appropriation has been made therefor.

Sec. 28. Approval of expenditures. The controller of the 2 state department of administration is hereby authorized to draw 3 his warrant on the state treasurer upon the presentation of pay-4 rolls or vouchers duly itemized and approved in the name of 5 the chief executive officer of the state agency to which ap-6 propriations are by this act made available.

SEC. 29. Effective date. This act shall take effect and be 2 in force from and after July 1, 1963, and its publication in 3 the statute book.

SENATE BILL No. 360

By Committee on Ways and Means

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys 2 now in the state treasury to the credit of, or as may hereafter 3 be collected for, the Kansas educational building fund, created 4 and provided by article 6b, chapter 76, General Statutes Supplement of 1961, not otherwise appropriated, for the use and 6 purpose specified and to the institution or agency named in 7 section 2 to section 10, both inclusive, of the act, for the fiscal 8 years ending June 30, 1964, and June 30, 1965.
