

Senator Sanborn moved that Committee bills be introduced making fiscal year 1963 and fiscal year 1964 appropriations to the Forestry, Fish and Game Commission; and fiscal year 1964 appropriations to the Park and Resources Authority; and deficiency appropriations (fiscal year 1963) to the Civil Rights Commission, Pittsburg State College, School for the Deaf, Department of Public Instruction, Adjutant General, Women's Industrial Farm, Board of Probation and Parole, Penitentiary, Historical Society, Marais des Cygnes Park, and the Park and Resources Authority. Senator Hults seconded the motion. Motion carried. (See Attachments Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4.)

Senator Hults moved, and Senator Ward seconded the motion, that House Bill No. 146 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it be passed. Motion carried.

Senator Sanborn moved, and Senator Glades seconded the motion, that House Bill No. 147 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it be passed. Motion carried.

SENATE BILL No. 377

By COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

AN ACT making appropriations for the fiscal year 1963 for the operation, maintenance, support and functioning of the forestry, fish and game commission; authorizing the fixing of salaries; restricting the expenditure of certain funds and authorizing appeals connected therewith; transferring certain balances, amending section 2, chapter 16, Laws of the Budget Session of 1962, and repealing said original section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

SECTION 1. Section 2, chapter 16, Laws of the Budget Session of 1962, is hereby amended to read as follows: SEC. 2. To 3 the

SEC. 2. On the effective date of this act, the state controller is hereby authorized and directed to transfer any unencumbered balance in the account, "equipment buildings at the following state lakes—Geary, Lyon and Chase, Shawnee," of the general fee fund of the forestry, fish and game commission to the account, "equipment buildings at the Ottawa, Woodson, Shawnee, and Scott state lakes," of said fund and agency, which money shall be immediately available for expenditure.

SEC. 3. Section 2, chapter 16, Laws of the Budget Session of 1962, is hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official state paper.

SENATE BILL No. 378

By COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

AN ACT making appropriations for the fiscal year 1964 for the operation, maintenance, support and functioning of the forestry, fish and game commission; authorizing the fixing of salaries; restricting the expenditure of certain funds and authorizing appeals connected therewith; and reappropriating unencumbered balances as of June 30, 1963, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

PART I—SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS APPROPRIATIONS

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the following special revenue funds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964, all moneys now on deposit with the state treasurer to the credit of, or as may hereafter be collected by, or for, the forestry, fish and game commission as now provided by law or as may hereafter be provided by law, to the extent actually collected and available, to be used as provided by law, but not to exceed the amounts set forth in section 2 to section 4, both inclusive, of this act.

Any unencumbered balance as of June 30, 1963, in any of the following accounts of the general fee fund is hereby lapsed: repairs to Logan county state lake; Republic county waterfowl refuge; Douglas county state lake; drilling well at Cheyenne bottoms; Morton county refuge construction; equipment building—Finney county refuge; Barber county state lake repairs.

Upland game bird preservation and propagation fund 180,000

Any unencumbered balance as of June 30, 1963, in the account "Winter holding pens and housing for quail—Pittsburg quail farm" in the preservation and propagation fund is hereby lapsed.

SEC. 3. *Appeals to exceed limitations.* Total expenditures 2 (including encumbrances) from the special revenue funds listed 3 above for the fiscal year 1964 may not exceed the amounts 4 shown, except upon written application to the governor and 5 approval of the state finance council. Additional authorized 6 expenditures shall be made from funds in the respective special 7 revenue funds on hand and available.

SEC. 4. *Reappropriations.* Subject to the conditions and 2 limitations of this act, any unencumbered balance as of June 3 30, 1963, in any special revenue fund or funds heretofore ap- 4 propriated is hereby reappropriated for the same use and pur- 5 pose as originally appropriated for the ensuing fiscal year ending 6 June 30, 1964.

PART II—MISCELLANEOUS

SEC. 5. *Revolving funds.* Pursuant to the provisions of 2 section 76-2601 of the General Statutes Supplement of 1961, 3 or any amendments thereto, all revolving funds of the agency 4 named in this act are hereby made available to the agency for 5 the use and purposes as provided in such section.

SEC. 6. *Federal grants.* All federal grants and other federal receipts are hereby appropriated for the purpose set forth in such federal grant or receipts to the agency or other activity of the state receiving the same for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964.

SEC. 7. *Fixing of salaries.* Except as may be otherwise fixed under the state civil service act or other applicable laws, salaries or wages shall be fixed on an annual basis prior to the beginning of each fiscal year by the agency named in this act for its authorized employees. When salaries or wages have been so fixed the controller of the state department of administration shall be advised in writing and he shall be guided by such advice in passing payrolls for payment. Changes in such salaries made during the fiscal year shall also be reported to the state controller, in writing, for his guidance. Except as otherwise provided by law, each employee of the state shall be paid for the proportion of his annual salary earned each month as of the end of such month and as soon as is practicable after the end of such month.

SEC. 8. *Cash basis.* In all cases in which appropriations are made by the provisions of this act, the officer or person having charge of such appropriation shall, in no case, by any contract, act or proceeding attempt to obligate the state of Kansas at any time to pay a larger sum or sums than that herein specifically appropriated, and no larger sum or sums shall be audited by the controller of the state department of administration for the purposes herein mentioned than are herein appropriated, and in no case shall any appropriation herein provided for be used for any purpose or purposes except that specifically stated herein; and no officer or employee of the

13 unless specific appropriation has been made therefor.

SEC. 9. *Approval of expenditures.* The controller of the
2 state department of administration is hereby authorized to draw
3 his warrant on the state treasurer upon the presentation of pay-
4 rolls or vouchers duly itemized and approved in the name of
5 the chief executive officer of the agency to which appropriations
6 are by this act made available.

SEC. 10. *Effective date.* This act shall take effect and be
2 in force from and after July 1, 1963, and its publication in the
3 statute book.

AN ACT making appropriations for the fiscal year 1964 for the operation, maintenance, support and functioning of activities of the abstractor's board of examiners, state board of accountancy, state registration and examining board for architects, state athletic commission, state board of basic science examiners, state board of healing arts, state hotel and restaurant board, state board of pharmacy, supreme court, supreme court nominating commission, and the state board of treasury examiners; authorizing the fixing of salaries, restricting the expenditure of certain funds and authorizing appeals connected therewith; reappropriating unencumbered balances as of June 30, 1963, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964; and authorizing the transfer of certain funds,

have had the same under consideration, and instruct me to report the bill back to the Senate with the recommendation that it be passed.
