

SENATE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Minutes of the Meeting
January 23, 1964

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Smith at 3:00 p.m. on January 23, 1964. All members were present except Senator Van Sickle.

It was moved by Senator Farmer and seconded by Senator Sanborn that the committee introduce a bill to create a revolving fund for the Department of Revenue which would enable them to do contract work in data processing for other state agencies. The motion was carried.

In response to a question regarding the requested deficiency appropriation of the agency, Senator Smith noted that all deficiency appropriations are usually included in one bill at end of session. A discussion followed relative to fact that such appropriations would appear in both budgets. It was pointed out that there are several such instances in the entire budget, such as that of State Printer, so total budget figure given each year was not a true picture of actual State expenditures.

Senator Glades presented the majority report of the subcommittee on the budget for the Superintendent of Public Instruction. This provided that the budget for fiscal year 1965 for the SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION be approved as recommended by the Governor with the addition of an Industrial Arts Consultant. Senator Glades moved the adoption of the subcommittee report. It was seconded by Senator Saar. (See Att. 1.)


Senator Warren made a substitute motion that the budget be approved as recommended by the Governor with no change. The motion died for lack of a second.

Senator Jones questioned the possibility of limiting the provision of the report dealing with the extension of the textbook rental aid program. Senator Smith noted the Governor had recommended this be extended only to October 1, 1964 and the bill could be drafted to use that language in order to limit the extension.

The question was called for and the motion was carried with Senator Warren voting no.

Senator Glades moved that bill be drafted for the budget of the Superintendent of Public Instruction as recommended by the Governor with modification as made by the subcommittee report. The motion was seconded by Senator Saar and the Motion carried.

Following announcement that the committee would meet again on Monday, January 27 at 10:00 a.m., the committee recessed at 4:00 p.m.
